- Athens State University signed and returned to the Department of Education, the Certification and Agreement on April 22, 2020.
- Athens State University assures that the institution has used 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
- The total amount of funds that Athens State University has received from the Department of Education pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for the Institutional Portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund is in the amount of \$422,516.00.
- The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act, as of December 31, 2020, totals \$422,517 from the student portion and \$413 from the institutional portion.
- Of the remaining \$422,103, of the institutional portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund, \$274,705.77 was spent on technology to enable online learning, training for faculty and staff in online course development, student technology, and social distancing measures.
- The remaining \$147,397.23 of the institutional portion of the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund, will be used on social distancing equipment, faculty training for online course development, and technology resources to further develop remote course content and will be expended by April 2021.
