- <u>Check out the types of funding available</u>, including Military Tuition Assistance, Tuition Waivers and Learning Partnerships, and the Tuition Payment Plan!
- <u>Check out scholarship opportunities</u> and priority deadlines.
 - <u>Fall:</u> Priority awarding begins April 1st.
 - Spring: Priority awarding begins November 1st.
 - Scholarship applicants will be <u>required</u> to have a complete FAFSA on file, regardless of federal financial aid eligibility. Complete your FAFSA early!
