#### **UPDATES FROM FACULTY SENATE**

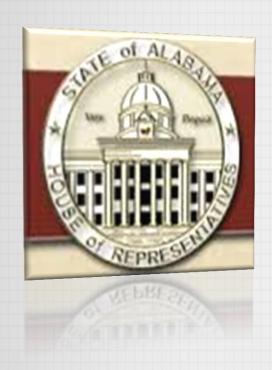

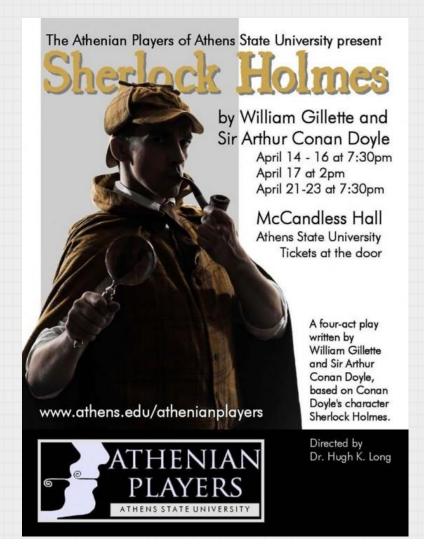

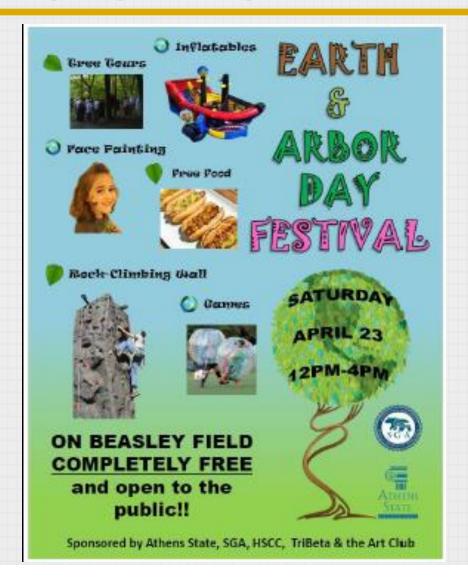
