ACADEMIC CURRICULUM POLICY

POLICY

The Athens State University Board of Trustees shall ensure that the University provides the key components for student achievement and success through various modes and in a quality, standards-based learning process with integrated experiences to develop and nurture each student and his or her needs. Therefore, the University shall consistently maintain academic programs to equip each student with the knowledge, skills, attitudes, and values needed to give responsible direction to one's own life.

PURPOSE AND SCOPE

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that effective learning shall be facilitated through the maximum and active participation of each student in the learning process, ensuring that personal meaning is derived from curriculum content and appropriate and relevant teaching and learning strategies. Self-assessment as well as standards-based assessment, grading, and reporting procedures will report on the quality of delivery. The learning experiences shall be included in concepts commonly taught in, but not limited to, the academic disciplines of educational theory and practice, language arts, fine arts, mathematics, science, social studies, business theory and practice, and career and life skills, or a combination of the above discipline areas.

The Board of Trustees shall approve all academic programs offered by the University. Additionally, new and/or modified courses that have been reviewed and approved through the University's Curriculum Committee(s) shall be submitted to the Board of Trustees for final approval prior to course/program implementation.
