On January 21, the Accounting Club held a meeting via Zoom with Karen Reetz representing Wiley Efficient Learning. Karen reviewed the steps to become a Certified Public Accountant (CPA), the education requirements, the application process, the four-part exam, and the final steps. To take the CPA exam in Alabama, one will need a bachelor's degree including 20 credit hours of accounting courses. To get licensed, one will need 150 total semester hours. Wiley offers lectures from subject matter experts with automatic grading, over 600 task-based simulations, over 7,000 practice questions in exam format, unlimited simulated CPA exams with performance reports, electronic textbooks and flashcards, and mentored discussions with university faculty.
