Strategic Planning Committee Minutes

February 23, 2022

The Strategic Planning Committee met on Wednesday, February 23rd at 11:00 a.m. in the Athens State Ballroom. Dr. Way called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. and welcomed everyone. There were no corrections to the January minutes and they were unanimously approved on a voice vote.

The focus of the meeting was to discuss the Information Technology Strategic Plan. Dr. Way turned the meeting over to Ms. Krigel who introduced the IT team: Ms. Linda Graves, Ms. Nicki Johns, Mr. Gary McCullors, and Mr. Jerry Stephens. Ms. Krigel presented "Information Technology Strategic Plan" (Handout 1). The members were divided into four groups for table topic discussions (Handout 2).

Group 1: Data – Guenther, Johns, Way, Wehlburg, and Wright

What are the difficulties/shortcomings of Argos or other report writing tools?

- Argos is not easy for end-users to utilize.
- It takes significant time and money to train new report writers to use Argos.
- Only a literal few employees have received sufficient Argos training to build complex reports and create dashboards.
- Some data formatting and validation decisions have historically been made in silos, which
 makes data difficult to locate, extract, format, and analyze. If data are not cleansed, this
 problem will continue to exist regardless of what report writing tool is used by the
 university.

What data analytics are needed to inform our strategies in each vice president's area? What do we have and what do we lack?

- We have a strong understanding of the need for better integration of data and analytics.
- There is a desire across campus to better use data for decision making.
- We would benefit from the introduction of dashboards and better forecasting tools.

How can the University identify priorities and move forward?

- Time and financial resources must be dedicated to creating a data dictionary.
- After a data dictionary is developed, time and resources must be dedicated to cleansing any corrupted/unreliable data.

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- Key campus stakeholders, i.e., data trustees and data stewards, must collaborate to establish new data management policies and processes.
- A decision must be made about what is best for the university: Should we improve our use of Banner or migrate to a new ERP/SIS?
- The university should begin searching for a query, reporting, and data visualization tool that is more intuitive and cost-effective than Argos.

Group 2: Finance/HR - Gooch, Graves, Ferguson, LaFevor, McCoy, Powers, Smith, and Wolfe

Functional Management Discussion

- Improvement in accessing operational data.
- Improvement in availability of specialized reports/dashboard.
- Improvement in digital forms/processing/workflows.

Challenges

- Lack of time for training and staff development.
- Evaluating the existing implementation against the possible.
- Staff workload.

IT/MIS Support

- Testing updates/patches.
- Technical skills/knowledge
- Assistance with queries and report writing
- All queries and report writing
- Functional area skills/knowledge

Group 3: Student/CRM – Barth, Latham, McCullors, Raby, Shephard, and Thornton

Functional Management Discussion

- We do not have a true enrollment CRM.
- As a third-party application, Argos Reports is a good tool, but hard to use without proper training. Each area does not have someone skilled in writing Argos reports.
- Duplicates created in Banner by Admissions Pros is an issue.
- Self-service functions in Banner are okay, but if we switched to Banner 9, self-service functions would be better.
- Had extensive discussion that as an institution we are still paper heavy and we need to have more things done in banner as opposed to copying and pasting forms.

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Challenges

- One of the biggest challenges is that departments don't have highly trained Banner users to train the people in the units.
- When new people come in, no one trains them correctly.
- Another problem is that when IT hires centralized Banner people and those folks get "trained-up" and become good at Banner, someone hires them away at a much higher rate.

Group 4: What We Have/What We Want – Carter, Delap, Jenkins, Spencer, Stevens, and Vartanian

What we want.

- Advising through Degree Works
- Campus-wide workflow solution (i.e. DocuSign)
- Transparent budget management need more training
- Student learning student peer-to-peer tutoring application

Dr. Way suggested summarizing all of the ideas and the associated costs in order for the cabinet to discuss the finances and determine the best ROI. Ms. Krigel thanked everyone for their input. Dr. Way stated the next meeting will be joint with Administrative Council. The meeting adjourned at 11:55 p.m.


