- Updated council members on presidential search:

 - Three five finalists will be selected to visit campus.
 - Campus visits: April 7 –16.
 - Open Forums for campus community, city leaders, etc.
 - Feedback from forums will be requested.
 - The goal is to have the new president identified by the May BOT meeting, assuming the position in July or August.
- Announced that the Faculty Senate voted to remove the 51-hour rule from the curriculum.
- Announced the COAS is working to develop courses to meet requirements for Gen. Ed courses
 - Spencer: distinguish courses designed for majors vs. courses designed for Gen. Ed. requirements.

Discussed the website design project:
