

## **BUDGET YEAR 2019-2020**

The operating budget request is \$35,500. This is the same as the request for the prior year. However, this does not include the continuation of the Augusoft/Lumens software, which has been requested as a critical need. This expense of \$11,500 should be moved to the operating budget, bringing the total to \$47,000.

Ms. Bell presented an additional critical need for a color printer. She indicated that the color printer for the center is no longer working. She did not estimate a cost for this printer.

Ms. Bell additionally presented a personnel request to continue employment for all current CLL employees. There are 2 part-time positions and 3 full-time (including director) positions. There is one part-time unfilled position that she would like to hold as an open position. She has also included part-time summer help to be filled proportional to camp enrollment.

Mr. McCoy reminded the committee that the Center is a part of the auxiliary budget rather than the general fund budget. The University subsidizes auxiliary enterprises for overhead and salaries that are not covered by revenue.
