Dr. Vartanian presented the operational budget request for \$138,050. This is a level funding request from the prior year budget.

Dr. Vartanian presented one personnel request for an Assistant Professor of Elementary Education. This is a replacement of Dr. Rosemary Hodges position. This open position was removed from the budget due to Dr. Hodges not teaching in her final two years at Athens State. Therefore, this is a new position request. The position has been being covered by adjuncts. Dr. Vartanian pointed out that elementary education is the largest major in the College. The projected salary is \$59,056.

Dr. Vartanian presented one critical need request for funding for the CAEP site visit. The CAEP accreditation site visit is November 7-9, 2021. This national accreditation is essential for our teacher certification programs. The University is responsible for travel, lodging and meal expense for the reviewers. Dr. Vartanian is requesting \$14,500 for this critical need.
