VP McAbee presented a budget request of \$160,058, down from \$167,058. She also presented an employee request for Scholarship Manager. The proposed salary is \$41,662. She is anticipating increased demands for scholarship/aid processing due to the following new initiatives: Honors College Scholarships, Bonner Cohort Funding, Gorgas Scholarship, the NSF S-STEM grant, and increased enrollment due to the Archer Education partnership.

VP McAbee presented a separate budget request for the Hanceville center to capture the rent paid for this location and the copier rental. This amount is \$32,200.

She also presented the budget for institutional scholarships, including tuition waivers. She is requesting \$1,327,500, up from \$1,100,000.

Finally, VP McAbee a new budget request for Student Activities. This is an auxiliary budget. She is requesting funding for Esports equipment, association dues and travel, as well as funding for other student club travel. The request is for \$51,695.
