- Title of Your Paper (centered and in Bold). Your title should only take up 1-2 lines.
- Author's Name: first name, middle initial,(s) last name
- Institutional Affiliation
- Course Number and Name
- Instructor's Name
- Assignment Due Date
- Note: Your title should avoid using abbreviations or unnecessary words.

## Abstract

Abstract

This section marks the start of your abstract. It should cover key elements of your research, including the topic, research questions, participants, methods, results, data analysis, and conclusions. The abstract should offer a brief yet comprehensive overview of your findings. Use clear language to highlight the most significant aspects of your study. A well-written abstract will enable readers to quickly grasp the core content of your paper. Remember, it should summarize your work without delving into specifics.

Keywords: Abstract, research, overview

- Your page should automatically include the header.
- "Abstract" should be centered and in Bold on line 1.
- The next line will start your key research summary (do not indent).
- You may indicate keywords from your research in your abstract. Indent as if you're starting a new paragraph and list "Keywords:" (italicized) and then, list your chosen words without italicize.
